Mississippi's 30 state-licensed casinos reported revenue of \$179.6 million in November, down about \$5.8 million from the same month last year.

Most of the decline again came in the Mississippi River region, from Tunica to Natchez. The 19 river casinos reported combined revenue of \$94 million, down \$4.2 million compared to November 2009.

The Mississippi Department

of Revenue does not include revenues from the state's Indian tribal casinos, which are not required to report their winnings to the public.
