

- State Sen. Wants Casino Revenue To Go To Police, Fire Pensions

**SPRINGFIELD, III. (CBS)** — It's not too early for people to start making plans for the money that would be raised by casinos which have not been approved yet.

State Sen. Bill Cunningham (D-Chicago) said 20 percent of the revenue of the city-owned casino in Chicago should go to the city's police and fire pension funds.

"First of all I am confident that eventually the General Assembly will approve a Chicago casino and what I hope to do with this bill is at the very least to start a discussion. The City of Chicago is looking at a pension ramp-up in the coming years that is going to come with about a \$700 million price tag," said Cunningham.

Cunningham said the gambling forces came close enough passing legislation the governor wouldn't sign, that he is comfortable looking at more casinos in the state in the near future.
