. "That's the reason I did it. Because what I could not do, and what I refused to do, was repeat what had gone before. What was the fucking point? So I'd rather have just one and gone, 'Okay, swing and a miss. There you go. Tried my best.'"

And his best is pretty damn good—Craig is now <u>often ranked</u> <u>among the best actors</u> ever to play the role. Still,

No Time To Die

seems to be the end of the line, as Craig has officially confirmed that it will be his last Bond movie.
