Casino de Monte CarloCasino de Monte Carlo is probably the most famous casino in the world thanks to multiple movies that chose it for its main location: Bond's Never Say Never Again and Goldeneye, Ocean's Twelve, in a total of 28 movies...The route of the Monaco Grand Prix passes through the casino and on some occasions the organizers of the Monte-Carlo Rally hold the ceremonial start in front of the Casino de Monte Carlo. There are seven restaurants on-site, including the 3 Michelin-star Le Louis XV. It is definitely a great spot for luxury travelers and gamers. KurhausKurhaus is Germany's oldest casino, and one of the most beautiful in Europe. The Wiesbaden casino gained international fame through the Russian writer Fyodor Dostojewski. He lost his entire travel budget in the casino and he wrote his short novel The Gambler in just 26 days to cover the debt.

Casino Estoril

Casino Estoril holds the status of the largest casino in Europe since the 60s. Ian Fleming was inspired by the stories from the Casino Estoril which became a meeting place for international spies and refugees during World War 2. The casino was one of the filming locations for the 1969 film James Bond 007 - On Her Majesty's Secret Service. Casino Estoril has also served as a backdrop for other films, including the film Taboo. Casino Estoril hosts its art gallery with paintings and sculptures on permanent exhibit.

The Clermont Club

Unless you happen to be a member of the royal, political, or business elite, you'll never enter the most exclusive gambling club in the world. The Clermont offers just six tables and its membership is on an invitation-only basis. The club was founded in 1962 by John Aspinall and the original membership included five dukes, five marquesses, almost twenty earls, and two cabinet ministers.

Casino di Campione

Another spy spot... this casino was actually made to try and entice foreign diplomats and garner valuable sensitive information from the diplomats during the First World War.

This is the biggest casino in Europe, with 9 floors for gaming and 3 floors for parking!The casino is located in the little Italian archipelago actually located in Switzerland, and it sits on the quiet banks of Lake Lugano.
